A reminder that school will be closed for the duration of the Christmas break.

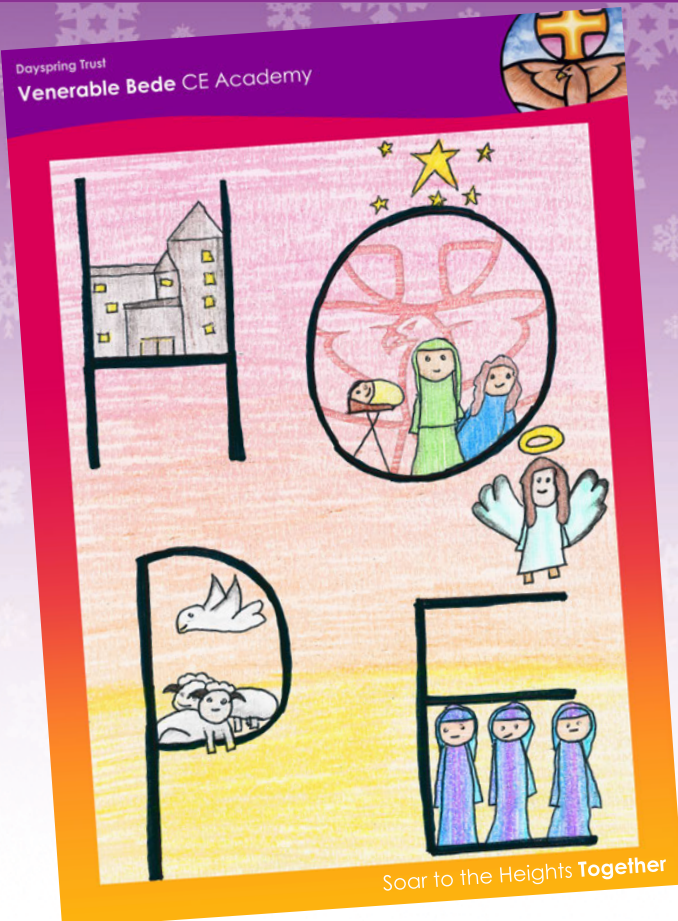
Please note that pupils return to school on Monday 4 January 2021. Our free breakfast club will be open from 7.45am that day. Pupils should line up as usual from 8.30.

CREATIVE WRITING COMPETITION

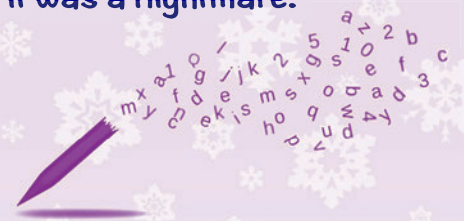
