I am very happy to provide some advice and guidance on the kind of things your year 11's could be doing whilst at home and in the absence of their exams. The suggestions below will help to keep your pupils engaged and provide a good foundation in preparing them for their next steps into further education.

Activities to do at home

Technical skills

Set yourself a 30minute uninterrupted drawing task. No phone, no computer, just 30minutes a day in a different room of their house or the garden etc to draw anything you like from observations (not the imagination).

• Documentation practice

A photo per day, whilst out of school, document the process with 1 photo every day.

Research

Research artists and designers you like and try to find more and more similar ones on social media.

Careers

We recommend https://discovercreative.careers/#/ - A Creative Careers website, where students and parents can access career profiles etc. Pupils could pick a different creative career each day to investigate, from working in a design agency to games maker, animator, museum curator, self-employed artist, photographer (different types; commercial, wedding, landscape etc), a day in the life of an illustrator. What do each of these jobs require? What skills? What's the good thing about these jobs? How much can you earn? Where do you work? Who would be your boss? Find the most bizarre place/job that a creative person works. You may also find the careers section of our website useful. This provides an overview of support we offer, useful tools and our digital version of the creative careers guide.

Still to Apply?

We are still taking applications to The Northern School of Art and we have simplified our admissions process. In most cases, students can participate in a virtual or telephone interview, and in some cases without a portfolio.
