PILGRIMAGE TO HOLY ISLAND

The Holy Island of Lindisfarne lies just off Northumberland's north coast, close to the border with Scotland and reached by a causeway, Holy Island is totally cut off from the mainland twice a day when the tide comes in.



With strong connections to both St Aidan and St Cuthbert, Lindisfarne is one of England's most important centres of early Christianity, hence the name, Holy Island. The island became a popular pilgrimage site and, as a group Year 9 pupils and staff did in July, it's still possible to walk in the footsteps of the early pilgrims to reach Holy Island, following the line of poles that can clearly be seen in the sand.

The Celtic saints often referred to somewhere as a 'thin place' when the spiritual atmosphere of a location made it easy to connect with God, almost as though there is no barrier between heaven and earth.

YEAR 7 EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING

This half term the school nurse has been back in school delivering emotional well-being sessions to some of our Year 7 tutor groups again.



The workshops have been designed to promote resilience skills in our young people and to encourage them to address the effects of emotional and mental health issues in a fun and interactive way. The aim is to encourage young people to open up and talk about how they feel.

YEAR 8 CPR

Year 8 tutor groups have completed an hour long session on CPR over the summer term. This was an opportunity for pupils to consider what they would do if they were with someone and they stopped breathing. CPR combines chest compressions and rescue breaths to give a person the best chance of survival following a cardiac arrest. Pupils are learning about the Push-Call-Rescue response and practising the CPR skills and techniques on dummies within their Personal Development lessons.

YEAR 9 SEXUAL HEALTH

This half term our Sexual Health Outreach Lead has been back in school delivering sexual health workshops to some of our Year 9 tutor groups. The workshops have been designed to develop pupils awareness on sexually transmitted diseases, unwanted pregnancy, coercion, violence and discrimination. Sexual health is a big part of life. It can affect and is affected by other aspects of health. This includes physical, mental, emotional, and social health. Being in good sexual health means you are well informed, careful, and respectful to yourself and others.


YEAR 10 NISSAN EVENT - TRY-Z


