Hard working staff and pupils are celebrating gaining top recognition for teaching and learning.

The Venerable Bede CE Academy's Religious Education department has clinched a prestigious national award for the fourth time in a row.

Delighted staff and students have been awarded the RE Gold Quality Mark (REQM), which has been developed to recognise

high-quality religious education in schools across the country.

Head of RE at the Sunderland academy, David Johnson, said: "The award recognised the outstanding learning in RE, both in terms of exam results, and the high enthusiasm and enjoyment students have of the subject."

Gaining the award was no easy feat for the Sunderland school, who had to provide thorough evidence as an assessor spent the morning with the department and senior staff, as well as pupils from all year groups.



REMEMBRANCE DAY PROJECTS

The 6th of November marked the start of Remembrance Week for Venerable Bede pupils. We launched the event by putting up the poppies on the gates outside of school. The display was made by our pupils who designed, coloured, and added their own personal messages to poppies to remember those affected by war. With the help of Year 9 pupils, and our senior prefects, the poppies were tied to the railings for all visitors, parents, carers and the local community to see and commemorate Remembrance Day 2023.

Throughout the week, pupils took part in Remembrance activities; these included fantastic tutor group door displays, whole school and year group worships and tutor reflection time. Our senior prefects also sold poppies and Remembrance merchandise to raise money for the British Legion. Pupils were really generous with their donations and it was lovely to see so many

of our young people wearing poppies with pride.

On Friday 10th November we held a two minute silence to remember fallen soldiers both past and present. The Last Post was played throughout school to mark the start of the silence, pupils then paid their respect and reflected on the impact war has on so many people and communities across the world.

On Remembrance Sunday several members of our school community took part in the church services at St Paul's in Ryhope and St Matthew's in Silksworth. Our senior prefects read at the service and we were all proud to join the local community in remembering those fallen soldiers.









ENGLISH DEPARTMENT QUALITY MARK 2023!

The Prince's Teaching Institute: English

In 2005, His Majesty The King (then Prince Charles) created what would be his 17th charity: the Prince's Teaching Institute. Building on the work of the initial summer schools and series of lectures by leading academics from Cambridge University, The Prince's Teaching Institute (now known as the PTI) launched the Schools Programme in 2007 to recognise and reward school departments that have ideas that inspire students and develop subject expertise.

To achieve the Schools Programme mark of recognition, the English department has had to demonstrate:

- Continued development of a broad and challenging curriculum
- A consistent improvement of teachers' specialist knowledge
- The creation of activities that enthuse and engage students beyond the curriculum.

The English department has earned this quality mark for the fifth consecutive year, awarded at the PTI Schools Programme Day. Having agreed challenging targets for improvement, PTI associated teachers and senior leaders review the evidence of progress made. The PTI Mark is given at the end of the year for

departments that achieve their objectives.

Mr MacIntyre, Director of English, said: "We are delighted to achieve this national award once again. It is a source of pride for the entire department to be awarded the PTI's quality mark, recognising the hard work and dedication in creating the best possible subject for our students."



ANTI BULLYING UPDATE

Anti-Bullying activities were completed during form time during the week including our own "odd socks" design and examining the differences between "bullying and banter," and how each can be identified.

POST 16 APPLICATIONS

Our pupils have been applying to post 16 providers since September and it is really important that if they haven't already applied that they make this a focus. It does not matter how many providers pupils apply for, a lot of pupils worry that they can only apply for 1, this is not true they can apply for all that appeal to them and make a final decision later in the year.

MUSIC MARK 23/34

We have, once again, been nominated by Sunderland Music Hub to become a Music Mark school for the 2023/24 academic year. We have been recognised for our commitment to a broad and balanced curriculum and the value that we place on music, and as a result, we have been nominated to become part of the Music Mark community.

Mrs Bonner, Head of Music, said "It's great to receive this positive recognition — especially considering the difficulties we've faced as a subject during the pandemic. The peripatetic team have done everything possible to help keep music active and raise it's visibility and importance in the school curriculum.

As a department, we have approximately 30% of the school population engaged in small group singing and instrumental tuition on a weekly basis and run several before and after school clubs from rock bands to singing clubs. We have had a number of pupils sit their external ABRSM and Rock school instrumental singing exams over the few years, both remotely and face to face, and received some amazing results. The music staff have aone above and bevond and worked collaboratively to get involved in every opportunity to keep music alive in school and provide pupils with the opportunity to engage in and enjoy live performances numerous times a year. From our termly concerts, to our talent shows and staff band celebration assemblies - there is something for everyone to

enjoy. I am so proud to work with such a talented and committed team of peripatetic staff and we are looking forward to another positive year working with our pupils."



PERIPATETIC MUSIC LESSONS

The uptake of small group and 1:1 small group instrumental and singing lessons this term has been phenomenal - we now have more than 30% of the school population taking part weekly. We offer tuition on guitar, drums, keyboard, s i n g i n g , woodwind, strings and brass. From January 2024 we have offered some additional spaces to pupils interested in signing up.
